**Psalm 95:7 & Psalm 100:3**

1. What does the rumination process of sheep teach us about how we feed on God's Word?
2. Who is our predator, and what is one way we can be protected from him?
3. Does the principle cautioning us not to follow the wrong crowd contradict the principle of needing to stay close to God's people? Why or why not?
4. What is the outstanding characteristic of the shepherd? How does this relate to our ability to trust God?
5. Describe a time in your life when you sensed the Holy Spirit warning you of danger (perhaps through His Word, your pastor, or another godly Christian). Did you heed or ignore His warnings? What was the outcome?
6. Are you as consistent and regular in digesting spiritual food (God's Word) as you are physical food? What changes can you make to give the spiritual food God provides the priority it deserves?
7. Flocks of sheep must be regularly moved to new pastures. In what ways have you grown in the past three months?
8. Do you have friends or acquaintances with whom you need to limit contact to avoid being drawn into temptation? List some.
